- Behaving in a manner which poses a threat to self or others.
- Behaving in a manner requiring police intervention
- Violating the home school's behavior code
- Operating a motor vehicle to, during, or home from the PJAS state meet
- Using tobacco products including electronic tobacco devices
- Bullying including verbal, physical, and cyber bulling
- Using cameras, imaging, and digital devices in showers, restrooms, or other areas where privacy is expected by participants
- Posting of inappropriate material on social media sites

*A student sent home automatically forfeits any award or scholarship for which he/she may have been eligible.
